

## BA (HONS) TOP-UP DEGREE PROFESSIONAL DANCE AND PERFORMANCE COURSE SUMMARY 2025 ENTRY

COURSE TITLE:	BA (Hons) Top-up Degree in Professional Dance and Performance
DURATION OF COURSE:	One year (36 weeks per year not including half-term)
ENTRY REQUIREMENTS:	Entry is via audition. Please refer to Central's 'Audition Criteria' which can be found on the schools' website.

	<ul> <li>For Direct Entry onto the course, the normal requirement will be:</li> <li>Successful completion of 240 credits on a directly comparable course (or equivalent)</li> <li>completion of required entrance tasks (a piece of reflective writingand a research task, and an audition).</li> <li>adequate physical, technical &amp; artistic aptitude (see audition criteria).</li> <li>previous training (tested at audition).</li> <li>interest in and aptitude for further academic study (tested at audition interview).</li> </ul>
	International Applicants International applicants may be required to achieve a minimum B2 Level, reaching a 5.5 score in each module band, in an approved English language examination such as International English Language Testing System (IELTS for UKVI), in time to commence their visa application in advance of the course.
	Continuing Students Students who continue directly from the CSB Foundation Degree are required to submit an application for the BA (Hons) Top-up Degree Course. Completion of the Central School of Ballet Foundation Degree does not guarantee direct entry to the BA (Hons) Top-up Degree.
	BA (Hons) Top-up in Professional Dance and Performance applicants are required to demonstrate a strong proficiency in both written and verbal English.
	Acceptance onto the course is at the discretion of the Artistic Director.

## COURSE OUTLINE: The BA (Hons) Top-up Degree in Professional Dance and Performance is a fulltime, one-year course, principally designed to offer a course of study that is continuous with that provided by the school's Foundation Degree course, or equivalent. The course comprises five modules of study with a total of 120 credits, which are all required to obtain the final degree award BA (Hons). This course provides a practical understanding of the technical skills and artistry required by the profession in Ballet, Contemporary and Jazz techniques with the opportunity to extend the skill base to virtuosic level, and provides training in aspects of musical theatre performance. Throughout the course, and extensively in the Ballet Central module, knowledge is used in creative situations working with teachers and external professional practitioners leading to public performance opportunities in a range of contexts, including a national tour of small and mid-scale theatres. The development of individual talent and unique performance qualities is achieved through the breadth of the curriculum, and, most importantly, the Ballet Central module. In this, the preparation and performance of a wide range of repertoire, requiring the practical application of different techniques and styles, alongside variations in artistic and musical interpretation and characterisation, facilitate the development of individual strengths and versatility, leading to the development of the distinctive and unique performing artist. **CORE MODULES:** Modules: CSB301 Classical Ballet (30 credits) (Including no of credits) CSBA302 Supplementary Techniques (15 credits) CSBA303 Professional Practice (15 credits) CSB304 Ballet Central (30 credits) CSB305 Independent Solo Project (30 credits)

Length of the Modules:	Students will also rehearse and perform in performance venues across the UK.  The Academic year is 36 weeks.

Where the course is taught:	At Central School of Ballet's Countess of Wessex Studios in Southwark, Central London.
The award students will receive on successful completion of their course:	BA (Hons) Top-up Degree in Professional Dance and Performance, validated by theUniversity of Kent.
	tutorials. Feedback from these sources combined with on-going self-assessment allows the student, in consultation with their tutor, to set regular learning targets.  Achievement is assessed by a variety of methods in accordance with the learning outcomes of the modules specified for the relevant level.
The overall methods of assessment for the Modules (for example exams, course work or practical assignments):	The course is a practical, vocational training course for dancers. This means that assessment is mostly of practical work both on a continuous basis and in formal assessment events. In addition, independent project and Contextual Studies work will be assessed both on a continuous and formal basis.  Feedback from all assessments is given with written or verbal comments. In addition, students receive ongoing feedback in practical classes and through
Workload including number of contact hours with School staff and expected self-study:	This is a vocationally orientated course; therefore, the number of contact hours exceed standard university courses.  Due to the structure of the course, rehearsals for the performance tour will cover the majority of contact hours during the Spring and Summer terms.  The course comprises of five modules to a total of 120 credits. One credit corresponds to approximately ten hours of 'learning time' (including all classes, self-led study and research). Therefore, obtaining 120 credits in an academic year requires 1,200 hours of overall learning time.
METHOD OF STUDY: (for example, lectures, seminars, work placements)	Award: BA (Hons) Top-up Degree in Professional Dance and Performance Credit requirements: 120 from the above specific level 6 <sup>i</sup> modules  Students must gain a pass mark for each module in order to be awarded their degree. The pass mark is set at 40%.  A range of teaching methods is employed for different learning outcomes and contexts; the knowledge is acquired though a number of routes. These may include:  Classes / coaching. Group and one to one tutorials. Practical workshops (Repertoire and choreography). Collaborative peer projects. Seminars focused on prescribed reading or learning assignment. Video screenings and analysis. Visits to theatre or other performance events where available. Rehearsals, performances, and lectures with professional practitioners. Independent research and presentation on set project, providing experience of structured intellectual enquiry and critical analysis, and demanding the ability to articulate observations and conclusions in a clear and persuasive written form. Self-led study.

Any extra costs (in addition to fees) which students may have to pay to complete the course and estimated cost:	<ul> <li>Direct Entry Students</li> <li>A one-off acceptance fee of £100 will be due when accepting a place onto the course.</li> <li>£650 deposit for home-fee paying students when accepting their place onto the course. This deposit will be deducted from further additional costs such as theprivate medical insurance. (Students on the Assisted Application Scheme are not required to pay this).</li> <li>Cost of completing a 'Health Certificate' as part of the Enrolment process. To be completed by the student's local GP. Please note, not all GPs are able to complete such a document, so it may be necessary to have this completed by a private Doctor. Prices will vary.</li> <li>All Students</li> <li>£1575.00 (estimated) private Medical Insurance. It is compulsory for students to have private medical insurance. Students are strongly encouraged to register with our school private medical scheme (currently provided by AXA PPP Healthcare) which is charged at cost by Central.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Approximately £400 - £600 each year for school uniform. Students will also need to account for the cost of several pairs of ballet and pointe shoes per year.</li> <li>£165.00 (estimated) for compulsory classical practice tutu (female identifying students only).</li> <li>£130.00 Resources fee which covers the cost of costume and castanet loan, locker hire and library resources over the duration of the year.</li> <li>£20.00 should a student lose their locker key</li> <li>Students will require access to a personal device i.e a laptop or computer and access to sufficient Wi-Fi to allow them to carry out the written or online elements of the course.</li> <li>Students are required to purchase a notebook / journal.</li> <li>£140 (estimated) for Audition photographs.</li> <li>£30 (estimated) for a Ballet Central hoody.</li> <li>£30 (estimated) to purchase a pairof steel toe capped shoes for the purpose of the Ballet Central Tour.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>£3,000.00 deposit (Direct Entry students only).</li> <li>£490 (estimated cost) for the cost of applying for a Student Visa.</li> <li>In addition to the cost of the visa itself, the student will be expected to cover any other costs that form part of the visa process, including but not limited to, the IELTS Academic for UKVI Exam (English Language Exam) and the healthsurcharge.
